

## **High School Advanced Concert Band 2021 Syllabus**

### **OVHS Instrumental Music Department**

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### **Program Objectives**

The Owen Valley Band program...

- provides students with high quality musical experiences.
- develops musicianship through performance both in and out of the classroom.
- educates and entertains our community with a wide variety of performances.
- instills in students a desire to continue to pursue music and musical experiences beyond their time with the Owen Valley program.

### **Course Objectives**

This course will...

- provide students with experience learning how to maintain and perform on a wind instrument.
- instruct students on multiple facets of music including: literature, history, theory, evaluation, and individual/group performance.
- Instruct students on multiple facets of the marching band activity including: posture, horn carry, movement, intervals, effect.

### **Required Materials**

Students must bring the following things to class each day to receive full credit for participating:

- Pencil
- Chromebook
- Headphones
- Instrument (one may be provided through the school on a first come, first serve basis. There is a \$50 per year maintenance fee for the use of school instruments)
- Wind Players: Reeds, oils, swabs, and greases necessary for performing on and maintaining their instrument (Reed instrument players should have 3-4 spare good reeds available at all times. Reeds may be ordered through Paige's Music in Indianapolis and are typically delivered once per week.) A list of suggested materials by instrument is attached.

Students will also need:

- Marching Band, Pep Band, and Concert attire for performances (see below)

### **Marching Band Attire**

**For Marching Band performances members will wear:**

Parades

- Parade/Pep Band Shirt (buy from school)
- Khaki Shorts
- Tennis Shoes

Football Games and Performances

- Marching Band Jacket and Bibs (school provided)
- Marching Band Shako (school provided)
- Marching Band Shoes (buy from school)
- Long black socks (no ankle socks)

### **Pep Band Attire**

**For Pep Band performances members will wear:**

-Parade/Pep Band Shirt (buy from school, same as above)

-Jeans

-Tennis Shoes

## **Concert Attire**

**For Concert performances members will wear:**

Gentlemen Ladies

-Tuxedo Jacket (school provided) -Black Blouse

-Tuxedo Pants (school provided) -Black Pants, Capris, or Skirt (knee length or longer)

-White Tuxedo Shirt (buy from school) -Black Belt (if there are belt loops)

-Black Socks -Black socks/black or tan nylons (optional)

-Black Dress Shoes -Black Shoes

## **Classroom Expectations**

- Be prepared with all materials for class, will be on time, and will remain in the area designated by the director.
- When someone addresses the class, stop talking or playing and listen.
- Follow directions the first time they are given.
- Keep hands, feet, and objects to yourself this includes instruments and chromebooks.
- No profanity, teasing, name calling, yelling or anything that may constitute bullying or hazing.

## **Technology Policy**

Chromebooks and cell phones may only be used during class for educational purposes when students have been given permission to do so. Students will receive one warning to put devices away, at which point devices that are out will be taken to the office.

## **Rewards Individual**

- Verbal praise from Mr. Cramer/Mr. Russell
- Positive contact with a parent (via letter, phone, or email)

## **Consequences**

*Individual consequences will be given when a classroom expectation is not being met. Individual consequences will reset each week, except in situations where students have a recurring offense. In that situation an individual student's consequences may be defined specific to that individual student and their behavior.*

## **Individual**

1. Verbal Warning
2. After school detention and parent contact
3. Referral (Further infractions result in additional referrals)

\*Severe Clause - Any action deemed severe enough may result in an automatic referral

## **Grading Policy**

Grading for this class will be based on the following criteria.

### Performances

- Marching Band rehearsals - 3 points
- Football Games - 25 points
- Saturday Parades and Contests - 50 points
- Basketball Games - 25 points each (double headers are worth 50 points)
- Dress Rehearsals 25, Concerts 50 points

Classroom Participation (Daily participation 3 points)

Assignments (Worksheets and quizzes have varying point totals)

Performance Assessments (Playing tests have varying point totals and may be assigned through Canvas)

## **Grading Category Descriptions**

### **Performances**

Student performances are the culmination of the work that the students put in at home and in the classroom and often mark the end of a class unit. The performances may include concerts, dress rehearsals, music festivals, football and basketball games, parades, contests, and other events that reinforce concepts taught in the classroom, broaden the musical experiences the student is exposed to, and allows them to develop skills that a student is not completely exposed to during classroom instruction (e.g. concert etiquette, overcoming performance anxiety, and evaluating performances).

After school performances and dress rehearsals are required as part of this course. The dates for these required events as well as optional performances are attached. The optional performances listed enhance the student's musical experience.

If a student is unable to make a performance, their absence will either be labeled as excused (performances points will not count for or against the student) or unexcused (performance points will result in a lower score or no points). A student may receive an excused absence from a performance when the student's absence:

1. Meets the criteria for a school approved absence as listed in the student handbook.
2. Fills out completely the appropriate performance/rehearsal absence form (forms available in the folders outside the band office).

Members that miss one or more performances may be dismissed from the HS Band classes.

### **Classroom Participation**

A student's behavior and effort in class will be evaluated. Due to the performance based nature of the class it is necessary for students to work together to achieve class performance objectives. Students that participate fully are better prepared to meet classroom expectations and objectives and also provide a truer assessment of their own development and skills. A student will receive a participation score based on the criteria listed above under "classroom expectations".

### **Assignments**

On a regular basis students will be given non-performance based assignments in class that will be used to reinforce concepts taught in class, to develop and use technical reading and writing skills within the performing arts curriculum, and to assess student achievement and comprehension of class concepts. Students may be asked to complete these assignments during class time or outside class time. Assignments that are assigned a due date must be turned in by the assigned date to receive full credit. Late assignments will be taken by Mr. Cramer/Mr. Russell on a case by case basis and may receive partial credit.

### **Performance Assessments**

Students will receive assignments that they must perform in order to receive credit. Students will be asked to prepare and perform these assignments to assess student achievement and comprehension of class concepts.
